I found it in a school music book we bought for 50c at a library book sale. #3 is "Jasmine Flower" which is a Chinese tune from a handout for a harp workshop Jean attended at the Memphis Dulcimer Festival. The Club meets in the Library, at the top of the ramp as you enter the Folk Art Center.

Handicapped Access is available: From Highway 70, go West from the Parkway just past the VA Medical Center to Riceville Road. Go to the Folk Art Center Service Entrance. A ramp leads to a second floor entrance.
