<u>MONTHLY TUNES</u>: For <u>April</u>: "Reuben Ranzo" – a sea chantey. "Conditions were very bad aboard whalers, and, in the opinion of the regular sailors, nobody but bums and misfits would sign aboard them. The fact that a good many whalers were recruited from waterfront riffraff amply supported this belief. This popular chantey grew out of these traditional beliefs." For <u>May</u>: "Scraping Up Sand in the Bottom of the Sea (Shiloh)" – a children's folk song from Missouri. To do it right, you need to add the finger play to imitate dredging machines, but then you couldn't play the dulcimer! For <u>June</u>: "The Crow-Fish Man" – a nursery song based on a street-cry, and collected by Cecil Sharp in Pineville, Kentucky in the early 1900's.

MEETING LOCATION/TIME

Second Sunday of each month from 2:30-5:00 at The Folk Art Center Upstairs Gallery, Blue Ridge Parkway, Asheville

The Folk Art Center is located on the Blue Ridge Parkway at Milepost 382, about 1/2 mile North of US 70, just East of Asheville. Take I-40 Exit 55 to Highway 70, then left to the Parkway, or take I-240 Exit 7 and go East on Highway 70 to the Parkway. The Club meets in the upstairs gallery, across from the top of the ramp as you enter the Folk Art Center.

Handicapped Access is available: From Highway 70, go West from the Parkway just past the VA Medical Center to Riceville Road. Go to the Folk Art Center Service Entrance. A ramp leads to a second floor entrance next to where we set up.
