## **DULCIMER CLUB NEWS**

<u>MONTHLY TUNES</u>: A quarter of 6:8 tunes, but no lumberjack songs this time! For <u>April</u>: *I'm Just a Rebel Soldier*. A rather opinionated lyric with an interesting style suggestion: "Savagely". For <u>May</u>: *Shoot the Buffalo*. A "play-party" song with lots of variations on the words and tune. Why it's suggested to play it "Gingerly" has got me! For <u>June</u>: *The Hobbies*. It's from between 1790 and 1815, but I couldn't find much more about it. This one says, "Animated", so we get a variety of styles this quarter!

<u>"LEARNING CD's"</u>: Our 2006-07 CD is now here, as well as an updated Tab CD! Our "Tune Learning" CD series now covers all WNCDC newsletter tunes from 1990-2007 in a series of ten CD's. Nine are audio CD's, and the tenth is a "Tab CD" with tab for all tunes as well as "mp3" and "midi" files of each tune. They're \$3.50 each at our meetings, or \$5.00 shipped. For paid club members, shipped they're \$4.50 for the first CD and \$4.00 for each CD after that in the same batch.



# **MEETING LOCATION/TIME**

Second Sunday of each month from 2:30-5:00 at The Folk Art Center Upstairs Gallery, Blue Ridge Parkway, Asheville

The Folk Art Center is located on the Blue Ridge Parkway at Milepost 382, about 1/2 mile North of US 70, just East of Asheville. Take I-40 Exit 55 to Highway 70, then left to the Parkway, or take I-240 Exit 7 and go East on Highway 70 to the Parkway. The Club meets in the upstairs gallery, across from the top of the ramp as you enter the Folk Art Center.

Handicapped Access is available: From Highway 70, go West from the Parkway just past the VA Medical Center to Riceville Road. Go to the Folk Art Center Service Entrance. A ramp leads to a second floor entrance next to where we set up.
