### **DULCIMER CLUB NEWS**

MONTHLY TUNES: A mix this quarter: a traditional song, a children's song and a hymn. For July: Old Molly Hare. A song related to the Celtic tune, Fairy Dance. There are lots of versions of the lyrics and the form. These lyrics are from Ruth Seeger in 1948. For August: Little Bird, Little Bird. Another children's song with lots of versions. Don't get thrown off by the timing changes – it sounds right after you get used to it! For September: Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing. A well-known hymn several centuries old. Again, versions of all, even if not on dulcimer, are almost always on YouTube.

The CD's are \$5.50 each, shipped. For paid club members, shipped they're still \$4.50 for the first CD and \$4.00 for each CD after that in the same batch.



# MEETING LOCATION/TIME

Second Sunday of each month from 2:30-5:00 at The Folk Art Center Upstairs Gallery, Blue Ridge Parkway, Asheville

The Folk Art Center is located on the Blue Ridge Parkway at Milepost 382, about 1/2 mile North of US 70, just East of Asheville. Take I-40 Exit 55 to Highway 70, then left to the Parkway, or take I-240 Exit 7 and go East on Highway 70 to the Parkway. The Club meets in the upstairs gallery, across from the top of the ramp as you enter the Folk Art Center.

Handicapped Access is available: From Highway 70, go West from the Parkway just past the VA Medical Center to Riceville Road. Go to the Folk Art Center Service Entrance. A ramp leads to a second floor entrance next to where we set up.
