DULCIMER CLUB NEWS

<u>MONTHLY TUNES</u>: October 8th: Roll On The Ground. One of a few old-time tunes this quarter. It even mentions Asheville! It's also known as "Big Ball's in Town" and was borrowed by Woody Guthrie for his song, "Miss Pavilchenko".

November 12th: *The Johnson Boys*. Another old-time tune, with lyrics from at least the 1920's but the tune is a fiddle tune that is much older. The lyrics vary by state, but it's definitely a tune that would have been played around here 100 years ago.

<u>December 10th</u>: *Sugar Hill*. Yet another old-time fiddle tune! As with the others this quarter, there are plenty of versions out there, fast and slow. This version is adapted from one the Charlotte Folk Society uses in its slow jams.

And our annual extra <u>Holiday song</u>: *Den Signade Dag*. It's a Swedish "morning psalm" also used at Christmas. It has at least three popular versions, but I love this one. Look up Kraja singing it on YouTube. You won't be disappointed!

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
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

MEETING LOCATION/TIME

Second Sunday of each month from 2:30-5:00 at The Folk Art Center Upstairs Gallery, Blue Ridge Parkway, Asheville

The Folk Art Center is located on the Blue Ridge Parkway at Milepost 382, about 1/2 mile North of US 70, just East of Asheville. Take I-40 Exit 55 to Highway 70, then left to the Parkway, or take I-240 Exit 7 and go East on Highway 70 to the Parkway. The Club meets in the upstairs gallery, across from the top of the ramp as you enter the Folk Art Center.

Handicapped Access is available: From Highway 70, go West from the Parkway just past the VA Medical Center to Riceville Road. Go to the Folk Art Center Service Entrance. A ramp leads to a second floor entrance next to where we set up.
