MONTHLY TUNES:

We're getting close to 450 tunes since we started the newsletter, and it's getting harder to find new tunes. How about a polka issue this quarter? They just happen to be tunes I ran across. I hope you like them! (And no, there's no lyrics page this quarter.)

<u>April 14th</u>: *Alter Nürnberger Dreher*. (*Old Nuremberg Turner*, or *Lathe Operator*) A traditional tune from Germany.

<u>May 12th</u>: *I Have A Bonnet Trimmed With Blue*. An Irish polka that's also a children's song. It was a Scottish pipe tune which "moved over" to Ireland, with many variations since then.

<u>June 9th</u>: *Pat Horgan's* #1. How about another Irish polka? This one goes by lots of different names and variations, but seems most consistent with this name.

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

MEETING LOCATION/TIME

Second Sunday of each month from 2:30-5:00 at The Folk Art Center Upstairs Gallery, Blue Ridge Parkway, Asheville

The Folk Art Center is located on the Blue Ridge Parkway at Milepost 382, about 1/2 mile North of US 70, just East of Asheville. Take I-40 Exit 55 to Highway 70, then left to the Parkway, or take I-240 Exit 7 and go East on Highway 70 to the Parkway. The Club meets in the upstairs gallery, across from the top of the ramp as you enter the Folk Art Center.

Handicapped Access is available: From Highway 70, go West from the Parkway just past the VA Medical Center to Riceville Road. Go to the Folk Art Center Service Entrance. A ramp leads to a second floor entrance next to where we set up.
